Not medically qualified as you know but I very much doubt there could be seepage at this stage. In fact they use blood patches to seel spinal fluid leakages as it clots so easily after epidural anaesthesia. 9

It is quite obvious that they clipped a nerve when you had the epidural hense the immediate pain and of course no it shouldn't have happened.

Low iron uptake is a tough one. Never heard of it but will search the site for an answer and if not will ask the question of the Doc. And the truth is Docs don't know everything and don't like looking stupid: whistle:
