The petition to sign against these ripoff numbers is at petitions.pm.gov.uk/NGN-use-by-GPs/ The petition is already 50th out of 8000 on the 10 Downing Street website so a few more signatures should get it from Page 2 to Page 1 by size on the Petitions website and ensure it gets some more coverage in the national newspapers.
